Catherine Beecher

Many of the ideas about American education considered "modern" today actually originated with Catherine Beecher, a pioneer in mathematics education and education for women. At a time when there was no university education for women, at age twenty, Beecher undertook a two-year independent study course to prepare herself for teaching. She opened a school for girls and then later opened a school to train teachers for the vast territory of the West. Some of Beecher's innovative ideas included encouraging teachers to use what are today called "visual aids," using blackboards to work problems rather than having students memorize everything, and expecting students to be able to communicate their reasoning in mathematical language.
